Welcome to the Teton County Scholarship Program (TCSP)! Before you begin the application process, please look through this booklet to familiarize yourself with the scholarships available and determine which ones best fit you, your goals, and your needs. There are scholarships to fit a variety of students, and we encourage everyone to apply. If you have any questions, stop by your school's counseling office or email your school counselor. FRIDAY, JANUARY 26, 2024 AT 5PM MST**

Materials and information needed to apply:

- **TRANSCRIPT.** Copy of your most recent transcript.
- **VIDEO ESSAY.** You will be asked to make a video (max 3 minutes) responding to your choice of one of three different prompt options from the college Common Application.
- **RECOMMENDATION.** One recommendation from an employer, supervisor, counselor, clergy, coach, mentor or teacher will be required for all applicants.
- **EXPERIENCES.** Employment history, volunteerism, awards you have received, clubs and activities, and leadership positions.
- **TEST SCORES.** ACT and/or SAT test scores, if taken. Provide the highest score if you took a test more than once.
- **FUTURE GOALS:** Intended major(s), colleges, and/or vocational programs you're considering.
- **FINANCIAL INFORMATION.** You will be required to provide information about your family's finances. If you have completed a FAFSA, you will be asked for the Expected Financial Contribution (EFC) from your Student Aid Report (SAR).
- **PARENT/GUARDIAN CONTACT INFO.**

- **SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS.** Many scholarships have unique questions or essay requirements.
- **APPLICATION TIPS.**
 - Some of the same essay questions appear across several awards; feel free to reuse responses as you deem appropriate.
 - All awards consider student effort, achievement, and/or growth. Most consider financial need.

2024 TCSP SCHOLARSHIPS

ALLAN D. OWENS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Allan D. Owens Memorial scholarship is sponsored by Owens Orthodontics. Priority will be given to students who have demonstrated leadership in school and/or community. Participation in activities and financial need will also be considered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be a current or past patient of Owens Family Dentistry or Owens Orthodontics.
- Essay: Describe how you envision your life ten years from now and how your high school education has prepared you to meet the challenges of the next ten years. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

ALPINE COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Alpine Winter Jubilee and supported by generous donors within the Alpine community, this scholarship is awarded to a student living in Alpine, Wyoming who has demonstrated exceptional community leadership.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Residence in Alpine (83128 zip code) or Etna (83120 zip code)
- Essay: Describe how you have supported your community through volunteerism, work experience, or other activities. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$500 one-time scholarship

AMERICAN LEGION POST OF JACKSON HOLE SCHOLARSHIP

The American Legion Post 43 offers a one-time scholarship to graduating seniors who will be attending any college or technical school. Students are encouraged to submit letters of recommendation from American Legion members who are not family members or relatives, and to provide the names of family members who serve or have served in the United States military. Winners are chosen based on the following criteria:

- 30% Participation in activities that involve patriotism and support of country and flag
- 25% Financial need
- 15% Extracurricular and volunteer activities in high school
- 15% Leadership experience
- 15% Academic record

REQUIREMENT:

- Essay: Describe what patriotism means to you. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$500-\$1,000 one-time scholarship

ARCHIE AND LOIS KEMPER JURICH FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

The Archie and Lois Kemper Jurich Family Scholarship is awarded to students with family lineage in Teton County, Wyoming dating to 1950 or earlier. Preference is given to students with financial need.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Family lineage in Teton County, Wyoming dating to 1950 or earlier
- Essay: Describe your family history in Teton County, Wyoming. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: Up to \$10,000 (\$2,500 per year for 4 years). Multiple awards may be given. Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

ART ASSOCIATION OF JACKSON HOLE HARRIET MINCZESKI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Harriet Minczeski Memorial Scholarship is awarded annually to a talented local High School Senior who plans to pursue visual arts in college. Harriet Minczeski was an educator, interior designer, painter and member of the Art Association. She was a great influence on those young and old and adored by all who met her. Molly & Jim Harris created this annual scholarship to honor and remember Harriet.

REQUIREMENT:

- Five digital images of your original artwork

VALUE: \$2,500 one-time scholarship

BILL HOLDA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Moran Volunteer Firefighters Association, this scholarship celebrates students and families who live in the northern part of Teton County, Wyoming. Special consideration is given to the children/grandchildren of Grand Teton National Park families and/or families of Jackson Hole Fire/EMS members. Other Teton County resident applicants planning to specialize in emergency services or resource land management careers will also be considered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Essay: Describe your educational/career goals, as well as how this scholarship will help you achieve those goals. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

BILLY FRANK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Billy Frank Memorial Scholarship was established by the Frank family to honor the memory of Billy Frank. Several scholarships are awarded annually to students who have demonstrated a high level of academic achievement and leadership. Scholastic ability, future goals, and personal essays are the main criteria used to select recipients. This award is for students attending college, university, or vocational school at institutions other than the University of Wyoming.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Not eligible for use at the University of Wyoming
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it? (Limit: 500 words or fewer.)
 - As his personal credo, Billy Frank said, "I sincerely hope humans are able to unify the societies of the world into a single dynamic in order to sustain the Earth." What do you think that unified dynamic would look like? How can you contribute to a healthy and sustainable world? How do your future goals help support a just and fair society? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$2,000 (\$1,000 per year for 2 years). Multiple awards may be given. Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

BRIAN CHAMBERLAND MEMORIAL GOLF SCHOLARSHIP

The Brian Chamberland Memorial Golf Scholarship is given in his memory by his father Raymond Chamberland and awarded to a student who displays a love of golf, works hard at their studies/academics and supports their community through good deeds and volunteerism. Brian was a member of the Jackson Hole High School Golf Team from 1988-1992 and won the 1992 3-A State Championship.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Active member of the Jackson Hole High School Golf Team – senior year involvement required

- Essay: What lessons have you learned as an athlete that shaped your character, and how will those lessons impact your future goals and ability to reach them? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$2,500 one time scholarship

BUFFALO VALLEY AWARD

This award is made possible by anonymous donors and given to students with financial need who reside in Buffalo Valley. Applicants must be well-rounded, planning to attend a two or four year college, and show a history of public service, community spirit and capable academic performance.

REQUIREMENT:

- Residence in Buffalo Valley (83013 zip code)

VALUE: \$1,500 one-time scholarship

Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

CHARLES REID SCHOUBOE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Charles Reid Schouboe Memorial Scholarship recognizes a graduating Teton County senior who embodies the spirit, character and leadership qualities of Reid Schouboe. Special consideration will be given to students with financial need who share some of Reid's interests, including his love of snowmobiling, snowboarding, dirt biking, roping, rodeo, cowboying, and hunting, as well as love for our unique community.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Resident of Teton County, Wyoming
- Participation in rodeo, hunting or motorsports
- Essay: Describe your love of and commitment to your community. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: Up to \$8,000 (\$2,000 per year for 4 years)

Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

CLARENE LAW SCHOLARSHIP

The family of Clarene Law along with Bank of Jackson Hole present a new scholarship to one graduating senior who exudes the character and drive of local lawmaker, entrepreneur, and beloved community member, the late Clarene Law. Law was probably best known, with her husband, Creed, and her family, for her role in our town's lodging business. The family owns the 49er Inn, Elk Country Inn, Antler Inn and Cowboy Village Resort. She spent seven terms serving in the Wyoming House of Representatives. Driven by the goal to help people, Law remembered everyone's name she met, and worked tirelessly to support her employees, constituents, and family.

Applicants should have an interest in business, politics, and philanthropy and a deep appreciation for family, education, and community.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Essay: Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$5,000 one-time scholarship

THE CLUB AT 3 CREEK SCHOLARSHIP

The Club at 3 Creek awards scholarships to students with financial need who have demonstrated community involvement, leadership, grit, and/or resilience in the face of adversity.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Essay: What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: Up to \$10,000 (\$2,500 per year for 4 years). Multiple scholarships may be awarded. Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

THE CLUB AT 3 CREEK EMPLOYEE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is designed to advance the academic success of local students who have been closely involved with The Club at 3 Creek. Work history and financial need will be considered when making awards.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must have worked at least one summer at The Club at 3 Creek for a minimum of 250 hours (documentation required) or be the child of a full-time employee at The Club at 3 Creek.
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Residence in Teton County, Wyoming or a neighboring county
- Essay: What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: Up to \$30,000 (\$7,500 per year for 4 years). Multiple scholarships may be awarded. (This award is also available to college students as a one-time award up to \$7,500 with the opportunity to reapply annually.)
Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

CRIMESTOPPERS SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by Jackson Hole Crimestoppers, this scholarship goes to a graduating senior who is planning to enter a career in the criminal justice field.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in criminal justice or a related field (including, though not limited to, a career as a police officer, deputy, crime scene technician, forensics technician, federal agent, or the Department of Homeland Security)
- Essay: Describe your career goals and how the scholarship would help you reach those goals. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$2,000 (\$1,000 per year 2 years with mentorship from Crimestoppers)

DAVE HANSEN WHITEWATER SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by Dave Hansen Whitewater, this scholarship is awarded to students who exemplify a love and appreciation for rivers and all the great adventures and activities they open our world to. The recipient will be a student who is passionate about floating, paddling, fishing, understanding, and/or protecting rivers.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- attending a 2 or 4 year college
- Students who have an active interest in river recreation
- Essay Question #1 (500 words or less): How have rivers impacted your life?
- Question #2 : Have you previously worked for Dave Hansen Whitewater?

VALUE: \$1,000 one time scholarship.

DAVEY JACKSON CHAPTER OF THE DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION SCHOLARSHIPS

The National Society of Daughters of the American Revolution, and the Davey Jackson Chapter, has three missions that guide our service in the community: Education, Patriotism, and Historic Preservation. We provide college bound seniors scholarships as part of our chapter American History essay contest.:

REQUIREMENTS:

- College bound student with a C+ or higher grade point average
- Essays will be between 750 and 1,500 words; font size 12 and submitted as a pdf
- Essays will cite 3-5 sources to support the facts. (include books and educational journals)
- Essays will be double spaced.
- Essays will have an introduction, body, and conclusion.
- Essays will have a title page without the student's name.

- **Essay Prompt:** You are a neighbor of George Washington in 1776 and interact with him occasionally. Discuss how knowing George Washington and the signing of the Declaration of Independence affected your daily life. Write from the point of view of a person living during that time. The person can be from any socioeconomic level of society, any political persuasion, or either gender. Share your love and understanding of history through exemplary and expressive writing.

VALUE: 2-3 scholarships will be awarded with a range of \$2,000-\$5,500 each

DELTA KAPPA GAMMA - CHI CHAPTER SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the local chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma, an international organization that promotes the personal and professional growth of women educators and excellence in education, this scholarship is awarded to a student planning to study education or pursue a career as a teacher.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in education or a related field
- Must identify as female
- Essay: Describe your interest in teaching and education. Include how you've made education part of your life, which TCSD teacher has influenced you most, and how you will continue to pursue education and/or teaching. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$600 one-time award

DON CUSHMAN COMMUNITY MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

The Don Cushman Community Music Scholarship, presented by the Jackson Hole Community Band, is awarded to a graduating senior who has played with this group to further the band's mission of promoting a traditional concert band repertoire and live music for our community. This scholarship honors the founding conductor of the Jackson Hole Community Bank for his dedication and passion for concert music.

REQUIREMENTS:

Jackson Hole Community Band participating member (within the last 2 years)
 Graduating senior from Jackson Hole, Star Valley or homeschooled
 Essay: How has music influenced you? What do you like about playing an instrument or with a group. Format options: written essay (minimum 150 words) OR video (1-5 minutes, mp4, MOV, WMV or AVI file)

VALUE: \$250 one-time scholarship

DR. BROOK TLOUGAN MEDICAL JOURNEY SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is named after 1999 JHHS alumnus Dr. Brook Tloughan, a past Teton County scholarship recipient excited to support students from the community that supported him. Dr.

Tlougan is now a board-certified pediatric dermatologist in New York, who values mentoring and supporting students interested in pursuing a career in medicine.

This award is aimed at nurturing future medical leaders and offers financial support to those dedicated to advancing healthcare. Preference will be given to students who intend to pursue a medical career that requires a graduate degree and have demonstrated exemplary academic achievement and leadership. Financial need is a consideration.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended undergraduate degree related to healthcare; preference is given to those planning to pursue a graduate medical degree beyond their undergraduate degree. Intended degrees could include (but are not limited to) Doctor of Medicine, Doctor of Pharmacy, Doctor of Physical Therapy, Doctor of Nursing Practice (nurse practitioner), Master of Physician Assistant Studies, Master of Science degree in Nutrition etc.
- GPA: 3.0
- Short answer: Please describe the undergraduate and graduate degrees you intend to pursue related to healthcare. (Limit: 200 words or fewer)
- Essay: What aspects of healthcare most interest you, what led you to choose a possible career in the healthcare professions, and how will you make a difference in patients' lives? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$2,500 one-time award

Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

(This award offers the opportunity to reapply annually in college during the student's undergraduate degree)

EAA YOUNG EAGLES FLIGHT SCHOLARSHIPS

Sponsored by the Experimental Aviation Association Teton Chapter 1049, the EAA Young Eagles Scholarship was created by a group of individuals who wanted to give students of Teton County, WY the opportunity to learn how to fly. This scholarship provides up to \$10,000 towards the cost of a Private Pilot Certificate, including instruction, flight time and books. Recipients will incur some fees, as the total cost of obtaining a license is approximately \$12,500. Students must demonstrate good academic standing, community service/involvement and a commitment to becoming a pilot. Financial need is a consideration. Having past participation in aviation-related activities will be looked upon favorably though is not required.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Interest in pursuing a Private Pilot Certificate
- Age 17 by June 1, 2024 and a junior or senior in high school
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Meet FAA medical eligibility requirements
 - Note: there are some medical conditions and/or use of certain pharmaceuticals that may be automatically disqualifying. [Click here for details.](#)
- Interview with scholarship sponsors

- Available 4-5 days/week June-August 2024 for training
- Essay: Discuss your interest in aviation, any experience you have in this area, and why you'd like to pursue a Private Pilot Certificate. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$10,000. This scholarship covers most of the cost of instruction and materials for a student to obtain their private pilot's license. May be awarded to multiple students.

ERIN'S FUND SCHOLARSHIP

This award is given in memory of Jackson Hole High School graduate Erin Goodman. *Students are considered only upon nomination by a teacher or counselor (i.e. is not a scholarship students apply for).* Preference is given to students who show motivation, always work to the best of their abilities, and demonstrate improvement during high school and resilience in the face of adversity. Financial need and lack of a clear support system are considerations.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Nominated by teacher or counselor
- Minimum GPA 2.5

VALUE: Up to \$4,000 one-time scholarship. Multiple awards may be given. Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

FOSTER'S OUTRIDERS VOCATIONAL/TRADE SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The Foster's Outrider Trade Scholarship was established by Foster Friess, nationally known financial analyst and noted philanthropist, and his friends. Two scholarships will be awarded per high school and open to graduating seniors who pursue a trade school or vocational training program for up to two years. Selection based on financial need, personal qualities and school activities. May include an interview, funds can not be deferred.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Essay: What are your educational and life goals?

VALUE: Up to \$5,000 one-time scholarship

FUZZY BUDDY ANIMAL WELFARE SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by a local animal lover, this scholarship will be awarded to a student with financial need planning to pursue a career benefiting companion animals, Wildlife Biology, or Animal Sciences. Education can be obtained at a traditional college, vocational/technical school or recognized certification program offering coursework leading to a career as a Veterinary Technician, Veterinarian, Animal Control Officer, animal shelter employee, dog trainer or animal behaviorist.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0

- Intent to pursue a career related to companion animals, Wildlife Biology, or Animal Sciences
- One recommendation, preferably from an animal care professional
- Essay: Describe your interest in and experience with animals, your reason(s) for choosing to pursue a career in animal care, and the educational path you intend to follow to achieve your goal. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$2,000 one-time scholarship, with possible renewal based on coursework

GEOLOGISTS OF JACKSON HOLE EARTH SCIENCE SCHOLARSHIP

The Geologists of Jackson Hole is a non-profit, all volunteer organization. Our mission is to inform and educate our members and the community about Earth Science related matters – their broad scope and importance to all of us. We are pleased to offer this scholarship to students with a passion for Science and who intend to pursue this interest in the future. This scholarship will be awarded to a student(s) graduating from a Teton County, Wyoming high school and who has been accepted to a four-year college or university. Applicants should intend to study STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) subjects. And preference will be given, in priority order, to:

- Those intending to pursue Earth Science
- Those intending to pursue other Physical Sciences (for example: Environmental Science, Physics, Chemistry, Astronomy)
- Those intending to pursue Engineering and/or Math

The main criteria used to select recipients is: high academic achievement, a strong interest in science, curiosity, and career goals. The scholarship must be used in the academic year immediately following the scholarship award.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Include at least one letter of recommendation from a Science teacher.
- Essay: Allow us to get to know you as a person, and cover how you became interested in Earth Science, what you have done to pursue your interest, and your goals for college. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$2,000 each and up to \$5,000, depending on qualified candidates, plus a complimentary one-year Individual Membership to the Geologists of Jackson Hole (GJH). In addition, recipients are welcome to apply directly to GJH for subsequent years of college scholarship aid.

GIRLS ACTIVELY PARTICIPATING (GAP!) SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship honors girls who participated in the Girls Actively Participating (GAP!) program during their middle school years. This scholarship does not allow for deferments due to gap years or missions. Financial need is a consideration.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Participation in GAP! for at least one year; preference given to girls who participated for at least three years
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Essay: Describe how you believe GAP! influenced, helped, and/or supported you throughout your three years of middle school. Some ideas to strengthen your essay include: specific examples or anecdotes that support your story, including a brief discussion of whether you would recommend Girls Actively Participating! to 6th, 7th, or 8th grade girls, and how you feel the GAP! program might be improved. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$500 one-time scholarship

GRAND TETON LODGE COMPANY/NORTH VALLEY SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Grand Teton Lodge Company, this scholarship is awarded to students who want to study/work in Hospitality, Outdoor Recreation, Culinary Arts, Environmental Studies, Natural Sciences or Resource Management.

REQUIREMENTS

- Preference for residences in Moran, Buffalo Valley, Moose or Kelly
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Intended major in Hospitality, Outdoor Recreation, Culinary Arts, Environmental Studies, Natural Sciences or Resource Management
- Submit an essay addressing why you are qualified for this scholarship, and what you intend on doing with your education after graduation.

VALUE: Three one-time scholarships will be awarded for up to \$2,000 each

GLR FINE ART SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by Jackson Hole High School teacher Gabriel Lopez. This scholarship offers an award for a high school senior who has studied in the dual program and has taken at least 3 years of Spanish at the High School level.

Requirements:

- First in family going to college
- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Attending a 2 or 4 year college
- Essay (500 words or less): How did the Dual Program impact you?

Value: \$1000 one time scholarship.

HARMONY DESIGN & ENGINEERING STEM SCHOLARSHIP

Harmony Design & Engineering believes that science, technology, engineering, and mathematics play a vital role in our country's future development and can help preserve our natural resources. The Harmony Design & Engineering scholarship for STEM higher education is a merit-based scholarship for undergraduate students pursuing degrees in science, technology, engineering, or mathematics.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Pursue a degree in science, technology, engineering, or math
- Essay: Describe how you would improve the environment through STEM. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

HEADWATERS DISTRICT BSA SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to seniors, boys and girls, who are currently registered and involved with good standing in the Headwaters District of the Boy Scouts of America.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Additional information required:
 - The number of years you've participated in Boy Scouts
 - Your present rank and troop/unit number
 - A list of your scouting activities, projects, camps, etc.
 - A letter of recommendation from your Scoutmaster or Venturing Leader

VALUE: 1,000 one-time scholarship. Multiple awards may be given. Possible second-year renewal for recipients in good standing.

JACKSON BREAKFAST ROTARY CLUB TRADE OR VOCATIONAL SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

The Breakfast Rotary Club of Jackson Hole provides scholarship opportunities for students attending a trade school or vocational training program of up to two years in duration that will lead to employment in a field of interest to the student. Criteria for selection are: intended educational pursuit, academic achievement, written essay, community service, high ethical standards, extracurricular activities, and financial need. Applicants may be required to attend an interview.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Essays:
 - What is your greatest achievement? What has been the biggest challenge of your life, and how have you overcome it? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

- Describe your interest in your chosen field. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: Varies

JACKSON HOLE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE MAYSIE REACH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This award is given by the Jackson Hole Chamber of Commerce in memory of Jackson Hole High School graduate Maysie Reach. Financial need is a consideration.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended business administration major
- Attend a Wyoming university, college or technical school
- Essay: Why does studying business interest you, and where do you see it taking you after college? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: Up to \$3,000 one-time scholarship

Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

JACKSON HOLE JEWISH COMMUNITY MAIMONIDES TRADE SCHOOL OR APPRENTICE SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Jackson Hole Jewish Community, this scholarship celebrates the philosophies of Maimonides, a medieval Jewish scholar, astronomer, and physician who is revered today as one of the most influential figures in Jewish philosophy. One of his most famous quotes is, "Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime." This scholarship does not allow for deferments due to gap years or missions. Open to all persons of any or no religious affiliation.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be used at a trade or vocational school, or in an apprenticeship program
- Essay: Please take a moment to look up Maimonides, select one of his attributed quotes, and then submit a brief essay on why it resonates with you and your desire to be an apprentice or go to trade school. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

JACKSON HOLE JEWISH COMMUNITY "TIKKUN OLAM" SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Jackson Hole Jewish Community, this scholarship celebrates the idea of Tikkun Olam - "healing the world" - through direct actions. Preference is given to students who have demonstrated leadership and good works in their community, who have shown a commitment to continued works of community service after graduation, and who have financial need. Open to all persons of any or no religious affiliation.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Essay: Submit a brief essay describing how you have lived the principle of Tikkun Olam and exemplified the idea of healing the world. (Please refer to the Wikipedia definition of Tikkun Olam at https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Tikkun_olam. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

JACKSON HOLE LAW ENFORCEMENT CAREER PROGRAM

The Teton County Sheriff's Office and Jackson Police Department offer a unique opportunity to encourage positive engagement and inclusiveness between our community and local law enforcement agencies. This program pays full tuition and fees at the student's college of choice in exchange for a minimum of three years of employment with either the Teton County Sheriff's Office or the Town of Jackson Police Department. The award is contingent upon successfully completing a background check and an employment agreement with one of these agencies. If students complete their secondary education and do not accept the employment offer, they must repay the scholarship as a no-interest loan. All majors are welcome to apply. This program is also open to previous Teton County graduates currently enrolled in either a two or four-year college.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Preference will be given to identifying members of the Latinx community (preference given to those who are bilingual in English and Spanish), females, and children of current Teton County Sheriff's and Town of Jackson Police Department serving officers
- Students will be asked to interview with the Teton County Sheriff's Office and/or the Town of Jackson Police Department.
- Students must pass testing requirements outlined by Teton County Sheriff's Office and/or the Town of Jackson Police Department (Written, Oral, Fitness)
- Planned commitment to participate in a paid summer internship with either the Teton County Sheriff's Office and/or the Town of Jackson Police Department
- Enter in Mentorship Program with Teton County School Resource Officers
- While all majors are welcome, the student must plan on a career in law enforcement.
- Essay: Describe what draws you to a career in law enforcement and what you hope to accomplish as an officer for your community.

VALUE: Full tuition and fees do not include living costs.

JACKSON HOLE LIONS CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Hole Lions Club Scholarship supports students who are pursuing either a traditional college education or vocational/technical training. Awards are based on financial need, academic performance, community service, awards/honors, and school activities.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5

- Essay: Describe your greatest achievement in your volunteer work in our community and how that work has supported the community. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$4,000 (\$1,000 per year for 4 years)

Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

JACKSON HOLE MOUNTAIN RESORT SCHOLARSHIP

The Jackson Hole Mountain Resort sponsors scholarships to graduating seniors planning to attend any college or university. Preference will be given to students who have been employed by Jackson Hole Mountain Resort in the past year and children of Jackson Hole Mountain Resort employees who have been employed by the JHMR in the past year. Points will be given for the student's current or previous employment, current and past employment of parent or parents, and parent's tenure at JHMR. The student(s) with the most points will be awarded the scholarship(s).

REQUIREMENTS:

JACKSON HOLE PERFORMING ARTS SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to a student pursuing performing arts (instrumental music, vocal performances, drama, or dance) as part of their education. Financial need is a consideration.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Pursuing performing arts as part of your education
- List of performing arts camps, programs or workshops you have attended
- List of three teachers with whom you have studied
- List of any performing arts-related awards or distinctions you have received
- Essay: Describe your interest in the performing arts. How have you made them part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue them? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)
- Applicants may be asked to attend an interview and audition with the review committee or submit additional materials showcasing their performing arts experience

VALUE: up to \$2,500 one-time scholarship

Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

JACKSON HOLE SKI PATROL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the friends and families of the Jackson Hole Ski Patrol, this award provides college scholarships to high school students whose spirit and love of mountain adventure honors the memory of ski patrollers no longer with us. Scholarship recipients will be chosen based primarily on their essay and their participation in a snow sport.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0
- Students must explain their active participation in snow sports
- Briefly describe what you enjoy and what you've learned from participation in the sport
- Essay: What was a significant event in your life that put you out of your 'comfort zone', how did it make you feel, what did you learn and how has it changed you? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,500 to 2,000 one-time scholarship

JH GOLF & TENNIS 18 HOLE LADIES GOLF LEAGUE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to graduating seniors who played for the JHHS Golf Team.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Active member of the Jackson Hole High School Golf Team – senior year involvement required
- Essay: Describe how golf has shaped your character. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: at least \$1,500

JACKSON HOLE YOUTH MOUNTAIN BIKING SCHOLARSHIP

Jackson Hole Youth Mountain Biking believes all high school students should have the opportunity to pursue higher education. This scholarship is for graduating seniors who will attend college, trade school, or any accredited licensure and certification programs after High School.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be an active participant in Jackson Hole Youth Mountain Biking and have participated in the 2022 NICA season.
- Essay: How has mountain biking and participation with the team positively impacted your life? Please share your post-secondary academic and athletic goals. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarships. Multiple scholarships may be awarded.

JAMES W. EDWARDS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Given by Owens Family Dentistry, this scholarship celebrates students who have demonstrated leadership at school or in the community. Participation in activities and financial need will also be considered.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be a current or past patient of Owens Family Dentistry or Owens Orthodontics.

- Essay: Describe how you envision your life ten years from now and how your high school education has prepared you to meet the challenges of the next ten years. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

KIWANIS CLUB of JACKSON HOLE JIM KAYE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to students who exemplify community service and leadership, the Jim Kaye Memorial Scholarship is sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Jackson Hole. Preference is given to students who have a history of community service and volunteerism. This scholarship does not allow for deferments due to gap years or missions.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Must be a current member of the Key Club at Jackson Hole High School
- Essay: Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

LATINA LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship celebrates the public service and community leadership of young women in Jackson Hole's Latinx community.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must have participated in TCSD#1's Latina Leadership program for a minimum of three years
- Must have completed at least 30 hours of community service in the last 3 years
- Essay: Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$500 one-time scholarship

LEVI DOWELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is given in memory of Jackson Hole High School graduate Levi Dowell. *Students are considered only upon nomination by a teacher or counselor (i.e. is not a scholarship students apply for).* Preference is given to students who demonstrate the ability to inspire others through subliminal humor, an independent drive, sense of adventure, compassion for others, and a positively-skewed contrarian ambiance. The successful candidate will likely have shown great strength in the face of adversity. Financial need and lack of a clear support system are significant considerations.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Nominated by teacher or counselor

- Minimum GPA 2.5

VALUE: Up to \$500 one-time scholarship

Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding.

MARIANA BATSON AUGÉ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Created in memory of life-long learner and teacher, Mariana Batson Augé celebrates students who share Mariana's love of education.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in education or teaching
- Essay: Describe your interest in teaching and education. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it? (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

NELSON ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by local consulting firm Nelson Engineering, this scholarship goes to a student enrolling in a 2 or 4-year accredited college and pursuing an undergraduate in engineering. Selection will be based on financial need, academic potential, and career goals including background and interest in mathematics, sciences and engineering. Special consideration will be given to individuals entering the civil engineering or surveying fields. The individual awarded this scholarship must use it in the academic year immediately following high school graduation.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Intended major in engineering
- Essay: What are your educational and life goals, and how will this scholarship help you achieve them? Describe how you became interested in engineering, as well as which steps you have taken to increase your knowledge and understanding of engineering and science. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$2,000 one-time scholarship

NMWA ART LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP IN MEMORY OF DICK JENNINGS

The National Museum of Wildlife Art sponsors this award, which celebrates a student whose passion for fine art and design has motivated them to improve their skills and share their talents with others. The student should be planning to continue their study of art and design at the college level.

REQUIREMENT:

- Five digital images of your original artwork

VALUE: \$4,000 one-time scholarship

ORDER OF THE EASTERN STAR CHAPTER #50 YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by Jackson Hole Chapter #50 of the Order of the Eastern Star, this scholarship honors students who are willing to work with others for the greater good. Preference is given to applicants who have an Eastern Star or any Masonic heritage.

REQUIREMENT:

- Essay: Describe your reasons for requesting financial aid, why you've chosen to pursue further education, and any other information that you feel will help the selection committee know you better. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: Varies, one-time scholarship

PATRICIA BODA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the St. John's Health Foundation, this scholarship celebrates the memory of Patricia Boda, who was a passionate advocate for nurses and nursing. This scholarship is intended to assist a student in their endeavors to make a difference in the lives of others through a career in the health sciences.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in nursing or a related field
- Essay: Describe the aspects of nursing that most interest you, what led you to choose the nursing profession, and how you will make a difference in patients' lives. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

PEER ADVOCATE SCHOLARSHIP

Community Safety Network's Peer Advocate Scholarship supports lasting change in the lives of those affected by domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking. Preference is given to students who have contributed to violence prevention, promoted healthy relationships among their peers, or who have committed to a career in violence prevention, social justice, or a related field.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must have completed Community Safety Network's Peer Advocate training program and at one point been an active member of the Peer Advocate Club at JHHS.
- Essay: Describe your interest and experience in the prevention of gender-based violence, sexual assault, and stalking, and particularly the prevention of teen dating violence. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: \$2,000 one-time scholarship

ROTARY CLUB OF JACKSON HOLE FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Rotary Club of Jackson Hole Foundation (“Lunch Rotary”) is proud to provide scholarships that support graduating seniors in pursuit of their postsecondary education. The awards are based on student character, financial need, academic performance, community service, awards, honors, school activities, leadership, internships, work study projects, and letters of recommendation. Students who have a relationship with Rotary, either through a family member or a club program (e.g. Interact Club, Student of the Month, etc), may be given special consideration.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Interview with scholarship sponsor
- Essay: Describe how you have supported your community, through volunteerism, work experience and/or other activities. (Limit: 500 words or fewer)

VALUE: Varies. Multiple scholarships will be awarded.

Winners are required to maintain a GPA of 2.5 or higher to maintain funding and submit an update at the end of each academic year.

RYLEE MCCOLLUM MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Sponsored by Paul Keogh with support from additional donors across the country, the Rylee McCollum Memorial Scholarship recognizes two graduating seniors who embody the spirit, character and leadership qualities of Marine Corps Lance Corporal Rylee McCollum. Sponsored by the Jackson Women’s Soroptimist Club of Jackson Hole, this scholarship supports educational opportunities for female students who value community service. Preference will be given to applicants who show financial need.

REQUIREMENT:

- Must identify as female

VALUE: \$1,000 one-time scholarship

ST. JOHN'S HEALTH AUXILIARY SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is given by the Auxiliary of St. John's Health with the goal of promoting the continuing education of young people and encouraging volunteer service. Applicants must be planning to pursue a career in a healthcare field. Special consideration will be given to students who have volunteered in a medical center, clinic or health-related environment.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Must be planning to pursue a career in healthcare
- Minimum GPA 2.5

TED JONKE MEMORIAL SOCCER SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Jonke family, this scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who is a member of the soccer team and will be pursuing an undergraduate degree. Selection is based on academic performance, community service, and participation in and passion for the sport of soccer.

TETON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS CONTINUING EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS

Sponsored by Teton County and awarded through the Teton County Board of Commissioners, this scholarship celebrates local students and is awarded to three seniors who live in Teton County, Wyoming.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Residence in Teton County, Wyoming
- Must attend University of Wyoming, an accredited community college or accredited technical institute located in Wyoming and be enrolled in the fall semester

VALUE: \$1,000 per year for up to four years. Students must maintain a GPA of 2.5 and must be enrolled full-time.

TETON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS STATE FUNDED SCHOLARSHIPS

Funded by the State of Wyoming and awarded through the Teton County Board of Commissioners, this scholarship is awarded to three seniors graduating from a Teton County, Wyoming high school.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Residence in Teton County, Wyoming
- Must attend a college, university, or community college in Wyoming and be enrolled in the fall semester

VALUE: \$500 per semester for the first year (\$1,000 in first year); one student may be selected to have their scholarship extended for a total of four years, provided a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or above is maintained.

TETON COUNTY SOCIAL SERVICES SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship, jointly sponsored by Mental Health and Recovery Services of JH (formerly Curran Seeley and Jackson Hole Community Counseling Center) and Teton Youth & Family Services, celebrates students who are committed to human services. Preference will be given to those holding a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Community involvement and job experience will also be considered. This scholarship does not allow for deferments due to gap years or missions.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.0

- Intended major in social work, psychology, or a related field (including but not limited to behavioral health, mental health, or substance abuse)
- Essay: Describe what area of human services appeals to you and why, and how you plan to use your degree. The essay should also address the experiences or skills you have that would help you be successful in a human services field. (Limit: 500 words or fewer.)

VALUE: \$2,500 one-time scholarship

TETON PINES EMPLOYEE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is designed to advance the academic success of local students who have been closely involved with Teton Pines Country Club.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Employment at Teton Pines Country Club for at least one summer with a minimum of 125 hours worked, and/or be the child of a full-time Teton Pines employee. (Applicants must provide documentation of employment, including year, job and supervisor, or parent's name and employment position.)
- Minimum GPA 2.5

TETON TRAIL RUNNERS TZ MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is intended to encourage and recognize the value in life-long running, as exemplified by the Teton Trail Runners. This may include the pursuit of competitive running, or may simply be a passion for recreational running and the positive impacts it has on our lives. VON GONTARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Sponsored by the Von Gontard family, this scholarship celebrates the spirit of the Jackson Hole community. The award is based on financial need, the essay, and an interview.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Minimum GPA 2.5
- Must attend the University of Wyoming
- Essay: Describe your life goals and how you expect to reach those goals. (Limit: 500 words or fewer.)

VALUE: \$16,000 (\$4,000 per year for up to four years if a 2.0 GPA is maintained)

Y2 CONSULTANTS SCIENCE & ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIP

Y2 Consultants, a multidisciplinary firm with offices in Jackson and Cheyenne, sponsors this scholarship to honor women pursuing a career in science or engineering. Strong preference will be given to applicants with extracurricular activities and a history of community service.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Intended major in the field of science or engineering
- Must identify as female
- Essays:
 - Describe your interest in science or engineering. How have you made it part of your life, and how will you continue to pursue it? (Limit: 500 words or fewer.)

VALUE: \$500 one-time scholarship
